
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<u>Phonetic Reading with Silent Elephant "e", Part 1 Phonemic Awareness</u> consists of forty-seven phonemic awareness lessons beginning with the VC sound pattern and progressing to CV, CVC, CCVC, CVCC, and CCVCC. The individual sounds in real and nonsense words are manipulated by isolating, blending, segmenting, matching, substituting, reversing, and rhyming.
